The experts attending the African Regional Meeting on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage held in Yenagoa, Nigeria 11th -12th November, 2013, wish to bring forward the following acknowledgements and recommendations to the concerned African UNESCO Member States:

- Strongly encourage countries that have not yet ratified the UNESCO Convention
 on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage to ratify this legal
 instrument and encourage the full implementation by countries which are
 already States Parties to the Convention;
- Adaptheir national laws to reflect the provisions of the UNESCO 2001 Convention:
- 3. Survey, map and inventory their underwater cultural heritage;
- <u>Build capacity</u>in underwater archaeology or get reliable, scientific and ethic consultant advice;
- <u>Strengthen public education</u>on underwater cultural heritage and build on it as a means to strengthen local, national and regional identity;
- Prevent the pillage of their underwater cultural heritage, especially by the implementation of the UNESCO Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage, in countries that have a already ratified the Convention;
- Welcome the decision of the Nigerian authorities to establish an underwater cultural heritage center in Yenagoaaimed at the safeguarding and experts training in terms of the provisions of the 2001 Convention.
- Strongly encouragesub-regional economic organizations, such asCAAS, EAC, ECOWAS, SADC and indeed AU, to recognize the need for cooperation and to ensure the region's commitment toward the implementation of the 2001 Convention.
- Calls on UNESCO Secretariat in cooperation with the African Member States
 to further reinforce the application of the Convention in Africa by producing
 programmatic documents and supporting initiatives aiming at, but not limited
 to:
 - Relevance and benefits of African countries ratifying the Convention combined with a wide range awareness raising framework;
 - Capacity building programmes, as both formal and informal education, in Africa for African expertsin association with, for instance, UNESCO UNITWIN Network on Underwater Archaeology;

- Government agencies create appropriate employment opportunities for the underwater heritage experts.
